RESOLUTION #7-9-90-H

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribal Council has delegated to the Oneida Business Committee authority to exercise the enumerated powers of the Oneida Constitution, Article IV as amended, and

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as:

Commencing 200 feet NW of interstate of Ridge Road and Seymour Road thence NW 100 feet SW 214.5 feet SE 100 feet NE 214.5 feet to beginning. Part of Claim 133 T 23 N, R 19 E, .5 acres.

More fully described as follows:

That part of Claim 133, Township 23, Range 19, beginning at a point where the old Seymour Road intersects West Ridge Road, 3.56½ chains running North 64½° West, thence South 34° West 3.22 chains, thence North 64½° West 1.55½ chains thence North 34° East 3.22 chains, thence South 64½° East to middle of highway to place of beginning, containing ½ acre more or less according to survey.


WHEREAS, The above described parcel is requested in trust status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide future housing sites, and

WHEREAS, The Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement, and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs to initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcel in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.
