## RESOLUTION # 08-12-09-E *Self-Governance Multi-Year Funding Agreement*


- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government, a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and a Self-Governance Tribe with the Department of the Interior's Bureau of Indian Affairs and with the Department of Health and Human Services' Indian Health Service; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated authority under Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS,** it is the mission of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin to protect and improve the resources, the standards of living, and the environment in which the Oneida people live while maintaining, enforcing, and exercising the sovereign rights of the Oneida Nation; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has determined that entering into a multi-year Self-Governance Funding Agreement with the U.S. Government's Department of Health and Human Services' Indian Health Service pursuant to P.L. 93-638, as amended, supports and enhances the Oneida Tribe's sovereignty.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin approves the multi-year Funding Agreement negotiated with the Department of Health and Human Services' Indian Health Service for the period FY 2010 through FY 2012 and authorizes the Chairman to sign the multi-year Funding Agreement as negotiated.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin recognizes that there will be changes in the amount of funding received pursuant to the multi-year Funding Agreement for FY 2011 and FY 2012 and authorizes the Chairman to sign any other documents which may be required to receive funding under the Funding Agreements for FY 2011 and FY 2012.

### CERTIFICATION
