RESOLUTION NO. 8-31-84-B

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governmental body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section I, of the Oneida Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council to protect and preserve the sovereignty of the Oneida Tribe, its rights, and its resources, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee in the interest of continuing to provide the highest quality of health care services to its members and their families, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has established a rapport and good communications with John Buckanaga, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Buckanaga has a good understanding of the health concerns of the Oneida Tribe and has expressed his commitment to assist us with them, and

WHEREAS we believe that the transfer of John Buckanaga, IHS Bemidji Area Director, to the Albuquerque Area will disrupt health care services to the Oneida people.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the the Oneida Tribe of Indians is opposed to the transfer of John Buckanaga from the Bemidji Area for the reasons outlined herein.

NOW BE T FURTHER RESOLVED, that we are recommending that John Buckanaga remain IHS Area Director for the Bemidji Area.
