RESOLUTION # 09-23-98-B

Hwy. 72 Speed Limit 55 mph reduced to 45 mph

WHEREAS, the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribe Constitution by the Oneida General Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Nation is concerned with the welfare and safety of the tribal members that travel State Highway 172, and

WHEREAS, there have been serious injuries and fatalities on State Highway 172 in the Town of Hobart from County Highway GE (Pinetree) to State Highway 54, and


WHEREAS, the speed regulation on State Highway 172 is inconsistent with traffic flow and safety, and

WHEREAS, the amount of development and traffic trips has increased along State Highway 172,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Nation supports, along with the Town of Hobart, the petitioning of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation for the reduction of the speed limit to 45 mph along State Highway 172 from County Highway GE (Pinetree) to State Highway 54.
