Oneidas bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving army at Valley Forge, after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them.

RESOLUTION # 11-15-85-A

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council to protect and preserve the sovereignty of the Oneida Tribe, its rights and its resources, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Reservation is located near the heaviest industrialized area in Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, air quality on the Oneida Reservation may be affected by the nearby industrial activity, and
- WHEREAS, Indian tribes have the legal right to regulate air quality on reservations, and
- WHEREAS, E.P.A. and the Council of Energy Resource Tribes (CERT) have made funding available for development of air quality regulations.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Oneida Tribe supports the development of preliminary air monitoring regulations for the Oneida Reservation by EPA and CERT.
