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RESOLUTION # 12-07-05-CC Fee to Trust for the Former Richard P. Nachreiner Property

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as:
Former Richard P. Nachreiner Property at 470 Airport Drive, and
- WHEREAS, the parcel is described as follows:
Legal Description: See Attachment
Tax Parcel Numbers: HB-1347 & prt HB-1344, and
- WHEREAS, the above described parcel is requested in Trust Status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide an existing residential and agricultural land use, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement, and
- WHEREAS, prior resolution 5-04-05-R cited the incorrect legal description,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests that the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcels in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Business Committee Resolution 5-04-05-R is repealed.

A parcel of land located in part of Indian Claim 157 and in part of Indian Claim 159, being in parts of Section 2 and Section 3, Township 23 North, Range 19 East of the Fourth Principal Meridian, Village of Hobart, Brown County, Wisconsin described as follows:

Commencing at the Southwesterly corner of Indian Claim 157; thence N36°59'19" E 133.92 feet to the Northerly line of State Highway "172" and the **Point of Beginning**; thence N36°59'19" E 534.08 feet; thence N 55°55'39" E 1,009.57 feet; thence N55°35'29"W 481.73 feet; thence N89°49'47" E 132.00 feet; thence S89°52'48" E 592.31 feet; thence S36°56'14" W 409.00 feet; thence S55°35'29" E 176.15 feet; thence S44°40'42" W 709.90 feet; thence S0°26'46" W 32.52 feet; thence S88°29'49" W 172.00 feet; thence S0°26'46" W 355.25 feet; thence S88 °10'01" W 207.13 feet; thence N86°12'25" W 153.00 feet; thence 71.68 feet along the arc of a 1,372.39 foot radius curve to the Right, the chord of which bears N87°30'28" W 71.67 feet; thence N68°39'28" W 76.86 feet; thence 208.82 feet along the arc of a 1,183.24 foot radius curve to the Right, the chord of which bears N83°01'09" W 208.55 feet to the **Point of Beginning**.
