RESOLUTION NO. 12-16-83-A

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has an existing contract for Records Management with the BIA under P.L. 639; and,

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe's Records Management is eligible for a second year of funding from P.L. 638 allocations; and,

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin wishes to extend the existing efforts of Records Management; and,


WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin have agreed to maintain a Records Management System once the P.L. 638 eligibility is depleted.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin requests that the Records Management project be funded from P.L. 638.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Records Management Project run from January 1, 1984 to September 30, 1984.
