Meeting called for selection of CAP coordinator.

Purcell Powless requested of council permission to allow Wanda Webster and family to move into Site 2 because of a hardship. No dissent. Permission granted.

Amelia Cornelius moved to allow Housing Authority to continue screening of applicants for elderly units, seconded by Joy. Motion carried.

Interview of applicants: Sharon Weasel, Sylvester Smith, Myron Smith, Fran Kroehn.

Amelia Cornelius moved for secret voting, seconded by Norbert Hill. Motion carried.

Purcell Powless declares to vote with group.

Amelia Cornelius moved to destroy ballots, motion seconded by Irene. Motion carried.

Sharon Weasel selected as CAP coordinator.

Norbert moved to adopt resolution 72-09 to request Civil Liberties to review the imbalance of voting representatives at GLITC. Seconded by Ira, motion carried.

Irene moved to send a letter of support of the Youth Program to Geo. Brown, seconded by Norbert. Motion carried.

Norbert moved to request AAIA for technical assistance for By Indian contract, seconded by Ira. Motion carried.

Joy moved to accept Sharon Webster's resignation as CHR. Seconded by Amelia. Yes – 2, Abstain – 4, No – 1.

Tribal Council would like to meet with the Health Committee on the last Friday in Feb.

Joy Ninham moved to appoint Sly Smith as Interim CHR on the approval of Arvena Thayer, seconded by Ira Cornelius. Motion carried.

Purcell Powless and Gordon McLester will speak at the Indian Community School in Milwaukee with Norbert Hill as the alternate.

Norbert Hill moved to submit a proposal to Eugene Crawford to supplement our HIP funds. Seconded by Irene Moore. Motion carried.

Norbert Hill moved to poll the heirs of the Margaret Doxtator tract to see if they are willing to sell their share to the tribe. Seconded and carried.

Motion to adjourn, seconded and carried.
