ONEIDA TRIBAL BUSINESS COMMITTEE MEETING SPECIAL MEETING WITH LAND COMMITTEE & 701 PLANNERS September 25, 1973

Vice-Chairman Irene Moore called the meeting to order at 2:20 p.m.
Quorum present.

Business Conducted:

Loretta Ellis moved to adopt a resolution to amend Land Ordinance No. 1 to include amendment "Section 11." establishing 18 years of age as the minimum age requirement. Gordon McLester seconded. Carried.

Gordon McLester made a motion the Land Committee draw up appropriate land ordinances relative to leasing; subject to review and approval by the Business Committee. Alma Webster seconded. Carried. The Chrmn. recommended that updated copies of ordinances be sent to all persons residing on Tribal land.

Loretta Ellis moved to request the Great Lakes Agency to make an additional provision on the residential leases to provide the lessee the means to secure loan funds from the Farmers Home Administration. Gordon McLester seconded. Carried.

Recommendation to the 701 Planners that the Planners finish writing up their Affirmative Action Plan and present it to the Business Committee.

Gordon McLester motion to adjourn. Margaret Doxtater seconded. Carried.
