
Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc.

Wendell McLester moved to recommend that the President of G.L.I.T.C finish out his term. Irene Moore seconded. Motion carried.

Wendell McLester moved to adjourn. Norbert Hill seconded. Mtg. adjourned
