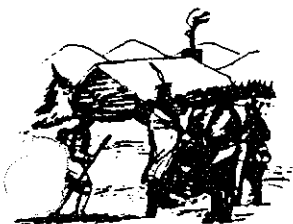


Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc.
