Norbert Hill moved to adopt Resolution in regard to changing the Arts & Crafts area of the Post Office project to be established as the Library. Second by Rick Hill, motion carried.

Mervin Jordan moved to rescind previous action of committee not to move the Library to the Post office project, motion second and carried.
