AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO SANITATION
AND
THE COLLECTION OF REFUSE

Section 1. Authority Established

There is herewith created a Public Utility of the Oneida Tribe to be known as the Refuse Collection Utility. Such utility shall be responsible to carry out the provisions of this ordinance and shall supervise a refuse collection system on the Reservation.

Such utility shall require that all waste collection and refuse storage systems which are in operation on the Oneida Reservation are in compliance with this ordinance.

Section 2. Refuse Defined

The term refuse as used in this ordinance, is defined to be all manner of kitchen and household garbage and rubbish, all offal including both animal and vegetable matter, metal, plastic, paper and glass food containers from which food has been removed, waste paper, and all other waste materials and things produced, or consumed including all waste matter from homes, stores or places of business of any nature and including rubbish, lumber, concrete, leaves, branches of trees, appliances, machinery, car bodies, ashes which may constitute a menace to public health or create an accident hazard or unsightly conditions.

Section 3. Refuse Containers

Refuse containers for other than bulk accumulation shall be galvanized metal containers not exceeding 32 gallons capacity, in good repair, leakproof, and rodent proof. Containers shall be fitted with adequate handles to facilitate collection and close-fitting covers that shall be removed only at times of filling or emptying.

Polyethylene heavy duty plastic bags at least 2 mils thick may be used by individual homes. Plastic bags shall not be used in lieu of galvanized metal containers but may be used as liners for same.

Section 4. Storage of Refuse

The following requirements are established as a minimum for the sanitary collection of refuse:

- A. Each residential property owner or occupant of any building or premises located within the community of Oneida, on the Oneida Reservation shall store all refuse in covered metal containers on elevated metal racks.
- B. The place where containers are kept pending collection shall be clean, free of spilled garbage, or foul smelling water or residue.
- C. Containers and rack shall be placed by the occupant in a place or location accessible to the collector(s) and acceptable to the Refuse Collection Utility.
- D. Plastic bags shall be securely tied when full and stored pending collection in such a place as to be inaccessible to pets, roving animals, rodents, or scavengers.
- E. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited any refuse in any place unauthorized for disposal on the Oneida Reservation.
- F. Containers shall be placed in the designated place for collection prior to the time of collection and shall be removed from any public way as soon thereafter as possible

- G. Tree trimmings may be placed for collection outside of a container provided such trimmings are secured in bundles of convenient size and weight and do not exceed 4 feet in length.

Section 5. Collection of Refuse

The following requirements are established as a minimum for the sanitary collection of refuse:

- A. Refuse shall be collected from each residence, business, and school at least once per week and more often if deemed necessary by the Refuse Collection Utility.
- B. The collector(s) shall empty contents of all containers into an approved vehicle without spilling any refuse.
- C. The collector(s) shall clean up all refuse spilled during collection and shall replace lids on empty containers.
- D. The collector(s) shall not damage cans or property while making collections and shall return containers to their proper locations or designated place.

Section 6. Transportation of Refuse

The following requirements are established as a minimum for the sanitary collection of refuse:

- A. Every vehicle used for the transportation of refuse shall have a hauling body constructed of metal.
- B. All joints in the hauling body shall be effectively closed and smooth so that no drippage or leakage of draining water or liquid or any debris can occur.

- C. Every vehicle shall be provided with a means of covering the refuse to be hauled and of keeping such refuse within the hauling body.
- D. Every vehicle shall be kept well painted, clean, and in good repair.

Section 7. Salvage Material - Junk

The following requirements are established as a minimum for the sanitary collection of refuse:

- A. Refuse deposited in a refuse container for collection by an authorized collector ^{can} ~~shall not~~ be reclaimed by the refuse collector(s).
- B. Removal and disposal of car bodies shall be the responsibility of the residential property owner or occupant of premises located within the Community of Oneida on the Oneida Reservation.
- C. Refuse not acceptable for collection, (e.g., concrete, appliances, machinery, etc.) shall be collected at a frequency designated by the Refuse Collection Utility.

Section 8. Financing

There shall be charged, assessed, and collected from each residential unit within the Community the monthly amount of \$ 2.⁰⁰, and from each business establishment the monthly amount of \$ 5.⁰⁰ or 50⁰⁰ per year.

The Oneida Business Committee shall delegate the responsibility for collecting these refuse fees to the _____
Tribal Treasurer.

Refuse shall not be collected from any premises where occupant is in arrears on refuse bill for a period of / month(s).
