Special meeting called to discuss reasons why elections was not held to elect tribal administrator.

Chester Smith move to repost the Tribal Administrator position, second Amelia Cornelius, 3 for, (R.H., A.C., C.S.), 2 oppose (L.M., W.M.), motion carried.

Loretta Metoxen stated that the 2 remain candidates are both qualified and can see no reason for reposting.

Wendell McLester stated he concurs with Loretta Metoxen and feels it is as injustice to the two remaining candidates to report.

Chester Smith state he feels that they still qualify as candidates.

Wendell McLester move to contact the 2 recommended candidates to see if they are interested in the position they need not go through the P.S.C., second Chester Smith.
