March 5, 1979  
8 p.m.

Request was made to adopt a resolution for Forest Management Plan requesting BIA financial and technical assistance. Pat moved to adopt the resolution as presented. Edwin seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Norbert moved to approve the lease application of Mike Melchert. Margaret seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Request was made to approve Lena Webster's application designating Dale and Orville Webster as beneficiaries subject to proper survey. Pat moved to approve. Margaret seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Margaret moved to approve a request to give Eugene Cornelius 30 days to comply with lease application and bringing  $\frac{1}{2}$  fair rental payments up to date or that the matter be turned over to the Solicitor. Pat seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Edwin moved to approve the budget revision of the Land Office. Norbert seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Norbert moved to approve the Goals and Objectives subject to format changes and the amendment "as proposed by the Land Committee". Edwin seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Pat moved to approve the Land Committee minutes of 2/14/79. Edwin seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

RNIP: Pat moved to approve the RNIP report for February. Norbert seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Pat moved to approve Harriet's travel request to the Stockbridge Indian Reservation on 3/13/79 to attend a meeting on the Indian Child Welfare Act. Margaret seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Pat moved to approve the travel request for Purcy and Norbert to attend the GLITC meeting at St. Croix on 3/14/79 and the Indian Child Welfare hearing in Duluth on 3/15/79. Margaret seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Anna John requested travel permission to attend a meeting on the Commission on Aging on 3/9/79 at Wausau. Pat moved to approve and Margaret seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion made by Norbert to adjourn was seconded by Myron. Motion carried unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 8:26 p.m.
