Purpose of the meeting was to discuss negotiations to be held on November 9, 1979 in Washington for litigation of the land in New York. Also to decide who will be going to the meeting.

Discussion concerning section 3. Oneidas of New York are not included in the complaint. This should be corrected to read "Oneidas of New York are included".

Section 62. Return of land was in the complaint, should be corrected to read "return of land or trespass damages".

The Tribe should ask for: 1. Trespass damages, 2. Return of title. NARF feels we have to file.

The Litigation ^{COM.} suggested we look over the complaint and decide when to file and get more information on Docket 301. Lengthly discussion of Docket 301. Some of the people present thought we should drop Docket 301.

There was a question as to whether or not the traditional Oneidas should be included as plaintiffs, this needs to be clarified.

Mark suggested that the Litigation Committee review the corrected Complaint before it is sent back. Francis will confer with Jerry Hill on Monday.

Docket 301 should be explained to the General Tribal Council and they should decide if it should be dropped or not. Mark made a motion to have a General Tribal Council Meeting on November 17, 1979 at 4:00 pm. Wendell seconded motion. Motion carried unanimously.

It was also decided that Francis Skenandore, Howard Cannon and someone from the Business Committee go to Washington. Mark made a motion to request BIA Travel expense. Wendell seconded. Motion carried unanimously. (NOV. 9, 1979 MTG.)
