



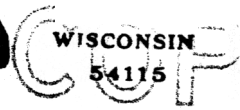
Oneidas bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving army at Valley Forge, after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them.

Purpose of the meeting was to ask any questions we had after reviewing the Iroquois Farms interim period progress report, which we had recieved prior to the meeting. (Interim period from 11/19/79 to 2/19/80)
Discussion on selling the Farm to the Co-op and also on the Farm belonging to the Community and it being self-sustaining.

Some of the Business Committee members agreed that we should give the Co-op an opportunity to buy the Farm. One of the main reasons for selling the Farm would be so that the Manager would be able to operate the Farm without politics interfering. The Land Contract is due on March 19, 1980.

It was decided that the Co-op come up with a proposed plan to buy the Farm and present it to the Business Committee.

Mark made a motion that the Farm Review Committee be abolished. Norbert seconded. Motion carried unanimously.
