SPECIAL MEETING

March 2, 1981
2:25 P.M.

PRESENT: Chairman, Purcell Powless; V-Chairman, Norbert Hill; Secretary, Wanda Webster; Treasurer, Wendell McLester; Mark Powless, Edwin King Jr.

ALSO PRESENT: Francis Skenandore, Jerry Hill, Ron John.

Purpose of the meeting was to discuss the appeal letter from Shirley Hill and also the public hearing on the Shoreland Ordinance which was scheduled for 3/3/81.

Francis stated the Amerindian Center, which is a state chartered organization is interfering into the internal affairs of the Tribe. Francis also stated that this should not be discussed at a regular meeting, as it is confidential between Kenneth Ninham and his wife. Francis gave a background summary of the situation. Jerry read a letter of response to Shirley's letter.

Motion was made by Wendell that the Lawyers respond to the Amerindian Center Administrator with carbon copies to her Board of Directors, as read by Jerry. Mark seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Francis stated Mrs. Ninham has filed discrimination charges against the Oneida Housing, Jerry read the response to the Complaint as drafted by the Law Office.

SHORELAND ORDINANCE:

Francis stated the original purpose of the ordinance was to improve waters on Duck Creek, but tribal jurisdiction is becoming the issue. There needs to be put a control on Mike Schaepe, he should stick to the original purpose of the ordinance. Mike is also working on a sewage district, to be located in Oneida. Francis stated that jurisdiction and taxation is the only thing on peoples mind, and that Mike should be instructed to stick with the ordinance. Discussion on the public hearing which is scheduled for March 3, 1981 on the ordinance. Francis stated it should be re-scheduled, as the issue is turning into jurisdiction and taxation.

Motion was made by Wendell to re-schedule the Shoreland public hearing for two weeks from today (March 17, 1981) and that Mike inform the proper agencies, also that Mike define his remarks to water quality and not jurisdiction.

Mark requested that anything Mike sends out go through Mark's office and the Law office.

Meeting ended at 3:30 P.M.
