Attorneys

Jerry Hill gave up-date and progress on constitution revision. Discussion followed 9:43 - 10:18 Executive session with Francis Skenandore.

TOBACCO ENTERPRISE

Barbara reported that police served papers on Ida Stevens from District Attorney's office. Ida is to appear in court on February 16th.

CENTRAL MAINTENANCE PROPOSAL

Sonny King made presentation to create a central maintenance program which would include Nursing Home maintenance staff. Program will provide preventive maintenance as well as repair work. Training will be provided for employees. Salaries to be determined by Business Committee.

Frank moved to accept results of election for Tribal Secretary. Seconded by Howard, Carried unanimously.

BILINGUAL PROPOSAL

Petition with 100 signatures was presented opposing Business Committee action of February 9th. Secretary requested to call Amelia, John, Don and Ron to discuss further. Mark moved to recess until 2:00. Seconded by Wendell, Carried unanimously.

Meeting reconvened at 2:17 P.M

BILINGUAL/BICULTURAL CONTRACT

Previous Business Committee action was discussed (see Minutes of February 9th). Tony moved to reconsider previous action - Seconded by Norbert - Carried. Frank abstaining. On further discussion Mark moved to approve proposal for 1983 funding Seconded by Tony. Carried with Wendell opposing and Frank abstaining.

Wendell's reasons for opposing were:

- 1) Proposal was not presented to Committee to read. Committee does not know what was sent to agency.
- 2) Fiscal responsibility is under his office. He does not feel comfortable approving on contingency basis.
- 3) Monies for an \$18,000 Tribal contribution are unidentifiable at this time.

Frank's abstention based on:

- 1) Not seeing a finalized budget
- 2) Not seeing the Proposal
- 3) Have not had an overview of evaluations to set priorities.
- 4) Funds to support program not identified

Job description was presented and reviewed - corrections made. Wendell moved to approve as corrected. Seconded by Frank. Carried.

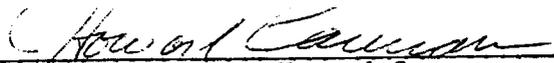
