MAY 10, 1982

Meeting called to order at 9:10 by Chairman.

ONEIDA ONE-STOP

Sales have increased since the opening of the store part. Gas will be going up. Sherman will develop a dress code at One Stop.

GRAND OPENING

Bruce King reported more people showed up than was expected. They planned for about 250. More than 350 people went through the store that day. Everything went very well.

Carl and Bruce will meet with the people in Ashwaubenon about the sewer services to the Multi-Purpose Building Site near the Airport, on May 11, Tuesday.

Mark arrived at 9:30.

The SunWay Building has to have storm sewer put in. This is an additional cost of \$800.00 and will be brought up to the Finance Committee. A new sidewalk will have to be put in at Oneida One Stop. Again this will go to the Finance Committee.

EDUCATION - Ron Skenandore

Hopefully there will be 22 graduates from Oneida. A list of the graduating will be given to the Business Committee by Ron. May 25 is the Dinner set for the High School graduates at Rock Gardens, at 6:00 P.M.

There was discussion on State aid vs. out of State aid. Mark asked how funds are considered for the students. He also asked if funds could be considered on a grade point average. Ron said he would get the information back to the Business Committee.

LAW OFFICE

Norbert asked what the status is on the Richard/Gloria Cornelius land. Francis stated he doesn't have enough information to respond at this time. The Town of Oneida is trying to get fire protection from the Freedom Fire Department for the south end of Oneida, but the Tribe has no input at this time.

Ambrosius Land - the agreement was closed out on Friday, May 7, 1982.

Fuel Tanks at Oneida One-Stop - The ownership is still in question about the fuel tanks.

Land Claim - Docket 301 - The dismissal of Docket 301 will be coming shortly now that all parties have agreed for dismissal.

Smeraud Hearing - The Smeraud hearing will be on May 17, 1982 at 10:00 A.M. in Judge Duffy's Court in Brown County.

Compliance of General Tribal Council Resolution - Memo from Frank Cornelius of May 7, 1982

"Because of the most recent action of the General Tribal Resolution, wherein the Business Committee was directed to hire a General Manager for Programs and Enterprises, I cannot in all good conscience justify spending 8 hours a day to receive my salary; therefore, effective immediately I will voluntarily go to one-half time. Any salary savings to my Tribe should go to purchase additional land.

This should in no way be interpreted as not serving my Tribe. Because I have always placed the Tribe first. I was elected, and I will continue to serve my people. If it could be proven that my presence is required for the full day at a later time, I will reconsider."

No action taken.

EMPLOYMENT RECOMMENDATION

The Personnel Selection Committee met on May 7, 1982 to hold interviews for the position of Tune-up Mechanic for the Oneida One Stop.

Personnel serving on the Committee were Mr. James White, Mr. Myron Smith, Mrs. Debra House-Powless, Sherman Thomas and Joseph Villagomez.

There were twelve (12) applicants for the position, but two (2) were no-shows. The remaining ten (10) were interviewed. The Committee ranked the top three applicants in the following order:

- (1) Gordon L. Skenandore
- (2) Edward D. Stevens
- (3) Linden D. Bain

The Committee is recommending the above based upon past work experience and qualification.

Frank moved to accept the employment recommendations of Gordon Skenandore. Wendell Seconded. Mark abstained. Motion carried.


TRAVEL REQUEST
