NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin hereby directs the Oneida Law Office to (1) Communicate the position of the Oneida Tribe to Ms. Skenandore, the Oneida Tribal Development Corporation Board of Directors, and Attorney Jim Presentine, and (2) Prepare to implement steps necessary to a legal action for the physical removal of Barbara skenandore from the oneida Tobacco Enterprise premises and (3) to have all property in the possession of Barbara Skenandore, including cash receipts from sales of cigarettes, and (4) to research the possibility of a Federal Criminal Complaint against Barbara Skenandore.

Howard moved to Approve. Norbert Seconded. Motion Carried Frank moved to adopt the letter to Ms. Skenandore Howard Seconded Motion Carried. Howard moved to approve of the shut down for inventory letter. Gorden Seconded Motion Carried


