DISCUSSION ON THE TRIBE'S CASH FLOW NEEDS


Kathy explained it is that time of the year when a new fiscal year has begun
and the funds to support the budget are not yet accessible.

As of October 1, 1985, the Tribe has been funding the majority of the programs
through Tribal operations. This has created a cash flow problem which will
smooth out when the federal funds start coming in.

Kathy requested authorization to negotiate a \$200,000 loan on a 90 day note.
This note would be drawn on as the need arises. The entire amount may not be
needed if the federal funds start coming in.

Lloyd moved to approve the request, Dave seconded. Motion carried.
