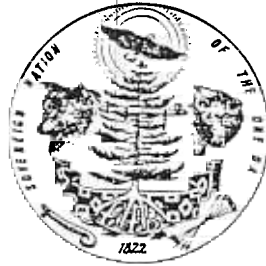

SALE OF PULL TABS

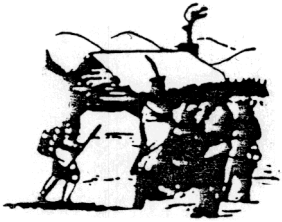
Francis Skenandore explained what the Lac du Flambeau Tribe v. Vilas County Lawsuit was about. This was an action filed by the Lac du Flambeau Tribe for declaratory and injunctive relief from Vilas County threatened enforcement against the Tribe for the sale of "pull-tabs" at its bingo games. The question before the court was whether the State of Wisconsin could prohibit the sale of pull-tabs by the Tribe on its own Reservation.

The Court held that the State has no authority to enforce the State Law governing raffles and lotteries against the Tribe for the conduct of its pull-tab games.

This matter can be appealed to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit. The appeal has to be filed within 30 days of the opinion being issued.

Discussion followed on what effects this decision has here on the Oneida Reservation.

Oneidas bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving army at Valley Forge, after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them


