Executive Session to discuss opinion in regard to complaint filed by Richard Cornelius.

Out of Session:

There is a need to recite the specific actions of the Indian Child Protective Board in regard to procedures and responsibilities.

There is a need to develop formal procedures for wage assignment for court orders.

There is a need to develop a policy for the identification of individuals for tribal employment. Direct Human Resource Department. The matter could be appealed to the General Tribal Council for a final decision. A meeting should be scheduled with the Indian Child Welfare Board, Attorney G. Hill, Attorney S. Cornelius, and the Business Committee to review the complaint after information on Indian Child Welfare Association is reviewed.

A letter is to be sent to Richard Cornelius informing him that the Business Committee is still deliberating and will schedule a meeting.

Discussion on the Creative Larsons contract for the TV Bingo Production. Attorney Hill is recommending approval.

Discussion on the sports betting/parimutual betting. This is at an impasse with the state and will be negotiated in the state compact.

Discussion of developing a Police and Fire Commission. Suggest assigning to Attorney G. Hill and Jim Danforth.
