

Rick Hill referenced items needed in the Cattle Plan: Long range planning, breakeven year of project, needs a management component, and should be treated as an enterprise, not a program.

Discussion on the plan and the need to revise or update so that it would be acceptable by the General Tribal Council. As it is now, most would reject the plan. The need for the project to cash flow positively and a comprehensive management component are necessary. The plan is basically three plans in one, 1) a beef cattle operation, 2) a feed lot operation, and 3) a cash crop operation. The three would at times overlap and sustain each other.

It was suggested that a project then be implemented to develop recommendations that could be presented to the General Tribal Council on April 9, 1990. Economic Development and Planning can become involved with the project as an enterprise. Rick Hill asked individuals who have comments to submit them to Chas Wheelock.
