Discussion and review of materials from the attorney in regard to the tribal retirement plan.

Lloyd Powless moved to approve the following recommendations:

1. Suspension of deductions and contributions to the plan.
  2. Send a letter to affected employees and hold special meetings to inform of the situation.
  3. Pursue legislation
  4. IRS - Ask for assistance and negotiate
    - a. Roll the 403(b) into a 401 (k)
    - b. Roll the 403 (b) into IRA's
    - c. Address penalties
    - d. Settlement
  5. Correspondence with C.J. Schmidt via Attorneys
  6. Obtain an IRS letter of determination/ruling prior to entering into another plan
- and to send letter to employees with recommended changes to include language that present funds are secure and penalties will be assessed if removed and that the cafeteria plan is not in jeopardy, second by Shirley Hill, motion carried unanimously.
