Precedent - Yakima Case - County can tax.

Problem worse case scenario that this could be a case of controversy for the original county lawsuit.

1. Law Office respond to restraining order if one is placed.
2. Letter of assurance to complete work and tribe will litigate on behalf of Patti & Jeff Skenandore.
3. Tribe will be responsible for civil fines by the Contractor in conjunction with this case.

Not arguing taxability; arguing control of individual by County or Tribe.
