Art Skenandore - looked at restructuring to downsize and meet cash needs.

Steve Van Dyke - Cause for down tarn:

Increased staff for DOE contract and other federal contracts Federal projects slow Continued to invest infederal contracts Stop working with core customers

WAYNE: Immediate staff reduction will save \$40,000 monthly. Impact will not be in effect until December. Approximate staff lay offs. 6 Tribal members. 14 Non tribal members. 38 remain, 17 non tribal, 21 Native Americans.

Environmental Health

Mason street wastes have been removed and most wastes will be removed by mid November. Saving on lease if Fain purchases lease.

Doing chemical inventory with Foth & Van Dyke. Updating Oneida Environmental. Will be contacting DILHR or similar, sub contractor for 3rd party review. In process of removing flammables, Foth & Van Dyke designing chemical storage room HVAC design hood and vent flow for corrosives.

Develop Health & safety list of equipment. Reviewing chemicals and how to work with each one and for storage. Chemical testing badges are being implemented. TRaining - being implemented by Marcia, some staff have taken voluntary leaves.

Believe they have cut staff to handle present work. Take some unused equipment and store and save on maintenance costs.

HRD will send memo to ORTEK employees about available positions. Possible options:

- Priority for ET positions
- Preference because they are tribal members
- Preference at tribal pools

HRD will need to get a waiver from the policies.

Accounts Receivables - A plan is developed.

Question on 2 GSA vehicles -- Wayne is aware of the mobile lab, this will be returned to the Tribe -- Wayne will research other vehicle.

REQUEST FOR COST OF CLOSING VERSUS KEEPING OPEN

T. A. funds will be available from Bureau of Indian Affairs in amount of \$300,000 for ORTEK, would have to amend 638 contract.

TA funds could be tailored to meet ORTEK needs

David Mathison assisted in release of funds for this purpose

Request for list of employees and salaries. Need to review salary levels.

Funds requested: Loan \$300,000 - \$600,000.00 = \$240,000.00 balance

Need another \$100,000 for environmental issue
