1. CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS - Concern that Rep. Prosser (47 members) & Kunicki (52 members), Senate 18 (D) - 15 (R), believes amendment will pass quickly thru Senate and also representatives.

WHAMO and Tavern League & Dog Track would like to reword amendments to give authority to Gaming Commission to add videos (Temporary alliance) to keep ballot off referendum.

Tavern League wants Videos. WHAMO wants to sell videos. Dog track contingent upon gambling.

Julie Barton excused at Noon.

Need to flood legislators with letters, cards, phone calls, and organize people at grass roots level.

Legislators resumes January 3, 1994.

PRO-ACTIVE:


1. Gather people who understand process of legislation in D.C.
2. Pension - Rostenkowski Office. Unclear how they will proceed on the tax Bill. No discussion. Bill in HR 11.

3. Housing - attempt to get existing 169 rental units under tribal ownership. Needs formal request from OHA to turn units to Tribe for individual ownership. Will possibly need funds.
4. Land Claims - Broydricks will analyze & provide recommendation on possible options to move the negotiations process.

Broydricks joined Lobbyist/Lawyer Co-op. Concern that Federal government will need to share cost of any settlement possibly 60-40 split. New York is in economic distress.

5. Request for Business Committee to be in Madison to meet legislators.
6. Utilize Buck Martin to move or approve of school construction
7. Broydrick Contract - Chairman appointed Loretta V. Metoxen to negotiate.
IHS - Facility - Nursing Home - Deanna Bauman & Mark N. Powless to follow up on new health Center/Renovation of Nursing Home).
- 9 NIGA - Will be working with NCAI on President's transition - No longer support Tony Hope, want Clinton Administration to review all the past rule making regulations. Sharon is on Tavis Bill for longevity and stability in Gaming.
