1. Indian Affairs are federal

Assistant Secretary Brown stated IGRA Act was best legislation for Indians.

Resolution has three points:

1. Define bad faith/good faith
2. Scope of games only authorized by State
3. Governors from adjoining states should not have influence on another state.

Target will be individual Congressional members.
- influence an opinion leaders.

Solicit Public Relation firms - highly targeted to opinion leaders to solicit support.

If constitutional amendment fails - other gambling may happen.


