Motion by Deborah Doxtator to oppose concept of direct per capita payments, outlined in two resolutions, from general fund, seconded by Julie Barton, motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Julie Barton to approve alternative plans: one alternative would be to lower the age of distribution of the current elderly trust plan and increase the amount being placed into that account another alternative would be to offer education benefits to every Oneida on our rolls. This type of plan would have a long lasting effect on those who chose to participate and would better the Tribe overall, seconded by Mark N. Powless, motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Russell Metoxen to have treasurer find \$500.00 from the Business Committee budget or F & A for funding Bill Richardson Honor Reception, seconded by Julie Barton, motion carried unanimously.
