
Green Bay Metropolitan Sewage District agreement to service three areas to homes for sewer via De Pere, Waste Water Treatment Plant

1 CFS present - limits amount to connect/small amount of growth.

Duck Creek Interceptor has larger Services potential, MSD is being reviewed by Robert E. Lee, study will cost \$20,000.00 to be completed by November 1993.

Duck Creek Interceptor will serve other communities prorated to 60/40 or total tribal portion of \$8,000.00

If Casino gets added in will limit growth for serving homes in Oneida area at least temporarily, need agreement with Green Bay Metro Sewage District by November 1993, and a commitment from the Tribe to Fund the \$8,000.00 for Robert E. Lee Study.
