WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has determined that the overall goal of the Oneida Nation is to protect, maintain and improve the standard of living and the environment in which the Oneida people live, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin had determined that the health, education and well-being of Oneida children and their families to be a top priorty, and

WHEREAS, Youth Educational Services assists and encourages Oneida students to succeed academically,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Oneida Business Committee approves submitting an application to the Green Bay Area Chamber of Commerce for the 2003 Asset-Building Mini-Grant program for the purpose of assisting Oneida students achieve higher levels of academic success.
