Oneida Community Health Center Grant Application to Indian Health Service Mental Health and Community Safety Initiative for American Indian/Alaska Native Children, Youth, and Families Grant FY 2003

- WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has empowered the Oneida Community Health Center with the responsibility of providing health care, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe believes that the Oneida Community Health Center in collaboration with other internal and external health care providers will uplift youth and strengthen families,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin/Oneida Community Health Center authorizes and submits this grant proposal for the Indian Health Service Mental Health and Community Safety Initiative for American Indian/Alaska Native Children, Youth and Families grant in order to develop a comprehensive plan which will benefit Oneida Youth and their families.
