- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as:
Former Tim J. Halbrook and John Ver Boort Property
- WHEREAS, the parcel is described as follows:
Legal Description: See attached.
Tax Parcel Numbers: 6H-765-4-1
- WHEREAS, the above described parcel is requested in Trust Status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide an existing vacant land use and will not be used for gaming purposes, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests that the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcels in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.

Part of the Northeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$), Section Twenty-five (25), Township Twenty-four (24) North, Range Nineteen (19) East of the Fourth Principal Meridian, in the City of Green Bay, Brown County, Wisconsin, more fully described as follows:

Commencing at the Southeast corner, Section 25, Township 24 North, Range 19 East; thence North 01° 11' 12" West, 1314.79 feet along the East line of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$, said Section; thence South 88° 57' 59" West, 35.00 feet along the South line of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$, said Section to the West right-of-way of Hillcrest Drive and the point of beginning; thence continuing South 88° 57' 59" West, 285.25 feet along said line; thence North 01° 30' 53" West, 500.67 feet; thence North 88° 57' 59" East, 120.00 feet; thence North 01° 30' 53" West, 315.31 feet to the South right-of-way of S.T.H. "54"; thence North 51° 16' 43" East, 0.03 feet along said right-of-way; thence North 76° 04' 08" East, 174.53 feet along said right-of-way to the West right-of-way of Hillcrest Drive; thence South 01° 09' 52" East, 854.93 feet along said West right-of-way to the point of beginning.
