### *118 - Education*

State of Wisconsin, Legislature approved a program for all school districts to initiate a "118 Contract" between schools, students, and the CEC. Once all signatures are obtained, the student begins an assessment and then works towards completing their GED/HSED. The CEC receives \$9.33 per hour from the state for the fiscal year 2010 for each student enrolled and active at the CEC. That rate is then billed to the school district and the school district can pay the CEC up to 60 hours of study timer per month for each student.

Must meet requirements for GED or HSED enrollment. In addition, a "118 Contract" must be initiated by the school, and signed by the school, the student, and the CEC.

### *5.09 - Education*

State of Wisconsin, Administrative Code, Public Instruction 5.09 states that this option will allow Wisconsin Technical College System districts, colleges, universities, and community-based organizations to request approval of programs which lead to high school equivalency diplomas under this section. The rules specify that the programs must be based on the high school graduation standards and include employability skills training and/or assessment.

#### Eligibility:

Must display significant learning disabilities as assessed by CEC staff based on state approved tests. If those disabilities are present, the student is then enrolled in to the GED program and must meet those requirements. (See GED Instruction for more information.)

A certificate of General Education Development that consists of a series of five tests; Science, Social Studies, Language Arts (Reading), Language Arts (Writing), and Mathematics. The CEC assesses the client's abilities and help prepare the client to take the GED test. The actual test takes a total of 7 hours and 35 minutes.

Contract Health Service funds are used to supplement other financial resources available to Native Americans. Federal regulations insist that Contract Health Service funds are to be used only after all other sources have paid.

The need for Contract Health Services must be determined by your primary care provider at the Oneida Community Health Center. Your provider will issue a referral for services and your eligibility for Contract Health Services will be determined by a Contract Health Representative.

All patients seeking Contract Health Services funds must provide a current Contract Health Services application with proof of residency, tribal affiliation, and must also apply for alternate resources for care if it appears you may be eligible.

Acceptable forms for proof of residency include: copies of official government papers, Motor Vehicle department documentation, direct deposit receipts or payroll stubs, utility bills (heat, water, sewer, and garbage disposal), cable, satellite, telephone, and cell phone bills, credit card statements, child support (checks, letters, or statements), acceptance letters (college/grants), dated transcripts with address listed, traffic citations, current active bank statements and e-statements with statement dates included, rental receipts or documentation from mortgage holder or landlord on letterhead. This could include a rental/lease agreement or mortgage contract. Notices from homeless shelters will only be considered for temporary proof of residencies valid for 60 days. Automobile and home owner/rental insurance statements. And magazine/media and subscription invoices. Your name, address, and current date must be visible and it must be a current document from within the past 60 days.

Acceptable forms of tribal affiliation will include: tribal identification cards and descendent letters.

Applications for alternate resources may include: Medicare, Medical Assistance, Wisconsin Well Women's Program, Disability, Kinship Care, Express Enrollment for Pregnant women and children etc. Patients are expected to stay compliant with Alternate Resources to receive Contract Health Services funds.

To help Contract Health Services process your bills efficiently: Bring all bills associated with your referral visit to the Contract Health Services Department as soon as you receive them. Respond to your insurance carrier if they request additional information.

Note the number of visits issued on your approved referral.
