as to treaty made by the old Indian in coming to Oneida. There were some family to remain in N.Y. or B. and those for A to come to Wis. and to relinquish all their rights to member of B.

Thos. Cornelius--When the old Chiefies came to Wis. and were to receive 10 acre of to 1 of their land in N.Y. and when they came here they found the land owned by other Indians; and so they sold their property in N.Y. to buy the land from the Indian now living in Green Bay, Wisconsin and some Oneidas came here later on to Oneida from N.Y. and were classed as homeless and when the land was to be allotted to the Oneida, the members of Tribe here at Oneida Wis. was asked by the Federal Commission as to whether they were willing to allow these homeless to be granted land here at Oneida Wis. and the agent requested the oneidas to stand on all one side of the road and then asked all those that are in favor of granting land to the homeless to cross the road, and nearly all crossed the road so the homeless from N.Y. that came here were granted allotment.

April 1, 1922

Motion made the N.D. Archiquette act as chairman of the committee seconded

I.N. Webster nominated as chairman of courts seconded

N.D. Archiquette elected

Motion made that the committee have a secretary and Edgar Skenandore nominated seconded--elected

Motion made that there be a special tribal meeting held on Monday April 3-19-22 to approve of a delegate and go call upon the agent and recommendation for a delegate to go to Washington to investigate as to whether we the Oneida of Wis. are shares to the 4,000.00 claim of Oneida N.Y. and also to other Oneida claims which the state of N.Y. has sold which belongs to the Oneidas.
