What can I recycle in my cart?



Metal/Bi-metal



Plastics 1-7 (no lids)



Cartons (no lids or straws)



Glass (metal lids included)

Paper, Cardboard & Paperboard



1. Carts must be placed curbside or roadside the night before or by 6:00 a.m. on the day of collection.

2. Collection days are Thursday or Friday morning.

3. Keep the carts 4 feet from each other and other objects, such as: mailbox, tree, vehicle, etc.

4. Burning of trash or recyclables is illegal and punishable!
