GENERAL TRIBAL COUNCIL RESOLUTION # 1-6-92-0

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee may be delegated duties and responsibilities by the Oneida General Tribal Council and is at all times subject to the review powers of the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, at the present time, tribal members do not have proof of when they applied for well and septic service, and


WHEREAS, much communication is oral and tribal members have no proof of information or direction that they received in regard to well and septic service.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that tribal members who apply for well or septic service shall receive a signed and dated copy of their application.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that any direction for well on septic service shall be in writing, signed and dated.
