GTC RESOLUTION # 5-14-05-A

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- Whereas, The Oneida Appeals Commission, the Oneida Land Claims Commission, the Oneida Gaming Commission, and the Oneida Nation Commission on Aging, are all important elected positions of the Oneida Tribe and,
- Whereas, The Oneida Land Commission who deals with the Oneida Land in Wisconsin, is just as important to the Oneida General Tribal Council as the above mentioned commissions,

Now therefore be it resolved, that the Oneida Land Commission which manages the Oneida Land in Wisconsin, in order to more represent the wishes of the Oneida people, shall be an elected commission.

Now be it finally resolved, that the Oneida Land Commission be elected positions and that the Business Committee request a special election as timely as possible to fill the board with elected seats after going through the APA process
