GENERAL TRIBAL COUNCIL RESOLUTION # GTC-11-22-93-B_


- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin,
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee may be delegated duties and responsibilities by the Oneida General Tribal Council and is at all times subject to the review powers of the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the General Tribal Council has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section I of the Oneida Tribal Constitution, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin desire's to continue to improve the standard of living and quality of life for its membership, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin employs a large number of its members and can have a direct impact on the minimum standard of living for its members through its employment and,
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has established a minimum wage scale above the federally mandated minimum wage, and
- WHEREAS, it is the goal of the Oneida Tribe to provide employment opportunities that meet the basic needs of its membership, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has established a wage scale that provides for opportunities for advancement of its members,
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin raise its wage scale 60 cents per hour in FY 1994, 1995, and 1996 which will bring the minimum wage above the poverty threshold for the area, and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin institute a retirement program in fiscal year 1994 that will be open to all tribal employees hired under the Oneida Tribe's federal employee number, and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a benefits program designed specifically for tribal members be researched and options presented to the General Tribal Council for its review and consideration, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribal Treasurer provide a written report on the implementation of the retirement program and the benefits program at the January 1994 General Tribal Council meeting, and at the July 1994 General Tribal Council meeting.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that a cash gift of \$225.00 be awarded for the next three Fiscal Years (1994, 1995, 1996) to ENROLLED TRIBAL MEMBERS ONLY.
