
Amendments to the Hall of Fame Ordinance

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of the Wisconsin; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS,** the Hall of Fame Ordinance was adopted by the Oneida Business Committee by passage of resolution BC-6-16-04-D to provide a formal, standardized means by which to recognize the personal achievements of Oneidas; and
- WHEREAS,** it is necessary to reconstitute the Hall of Fame Selection Committee (Selection Committee) because of the lack of community interest in serving on the Selection Committee as originally presented; and
- WHEREAS,** under the amendments attached to this resolution, the Selection Committee would consist of one Oneida Business Committee member, one appointed Tribal member, and the Quality Leadership Team, which is comprised of the Area Managers and Key Directors from all the service areas of the Governmental Services Division; and
- WHEREAS,** only those members of the Quality Leadership Team who are Tribal members or those members of the Quality Leadership Team who are spouses of Tribal members may serve on the Hall of Fame Selection Committee; and
- WHEREAS,** the amendments received a public hearing in accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act on May 15, 2007.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby adopts the attached amendments to the Hall of Fame Ordinance.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Office

The proposed amendments change the make up of the Hall of Fame Selection Committee because of the lack of community interest in serving on the Hall of Fame Selection Committee as originally presented.

The Committee, under the current law, consists of nine Oneida Tribal members. Under the proposed law, the Committee will consist of one Oneida Business Committee member, one appointed Tribal member, and the Quality Leadership Team which is comprised of ten members.

The Quality Leadership Team is comprised of the Area Managers and Key Directors from all of the service areas of the Governmental Services Division - Fitness, Recreation, Arts, Veterans, Community Education, Social Services, Education & Training, Cultural Heritage, Transit and the GSD Division Office - for a total of ten members.

It is required in the law that each representative of the Quality Leadership Team be either a Tribal member or married to a Tribal member. In the event that a Quality Leadership Team member is not a Tribal member or married to a Tribal member, a designee from the appropriate department who is a Tribal member is allowed to fulfill the role as a Selection Committee member under this law. It is not the intention of the law to restructure or change the composition of the Quality Leadership Team in any way.

The time frames for completing tasks were minimized or removed in order to allow flexibility for the Selection Committee.

The record keeping provisions were clarified, so that the Section Committee is only required to submit documentation for those individuals being inducted to the Tribal Secretary's Office. All other applications and documentation will be retained or disposed of by the Director.

The law has been formatted to comply with the Format for Laws and a public hearing was held on May 15, 2007.

83.1. Purpose and Policy

83.1-1. *Purpose.* The purpose of this law is to give recognition to those Oneidas, both historically and in the modern era, who excelled in the fields of academics, sports or other personal achievement, by paying tribute to these persons by enshrining their names and achievements into the Oneida Hall of Fame. Inductees into the Hall of Fame should have distinguished themselves and brought honor to the Oneida people by being a consistent representative of good character and high standard of conduct.

83.1-2. *Policy.* The policy of this law is to have a consistent methodology for induction into the

50 **83.2. Adoption, Amendment and Repeal**

51 83.2-1. This law was adopted by the Oneida Business Committee by resolution BC# 6-16-04-D and
52 amended by BC# _____.

53 83.2-2. This law may be amended pursuant to the procedures set out in the Oneida Administrative
54 Procedures Act by the Oneida Business Committee or the Oneida General Tribal Council.

55 83.2-3. Should a provision of this law or the application thereof to any person or circumstances be
56 held as invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions of this law which are considered to
57 have legal force without the invalid portions.

58 83.2-4. Any law, policy, regulation, rule, resolution, or motion, or portion thereof, which directly
59 conflicts with the provisions of this law is hereby repealed to the extent that it is inconsistent with
60 or is contrary to this law.

61 83.2-5. This law is adopted under authority of the Constitution of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of
62 Wisconsin.

63
64 **83.3. Definitions**

65 83.3-1. This section shall govern the definitions of words and phrases used within this law. All
66 words not defined herein shall be used in their ordinary and everyday sense.

67 (a) "Director" means the Director of the Oneida Nation Museum or a person designated by
68 the Cultural Heritage Department.

69 (b) "Hall of Fame" means the Oneida Hall of Fame.

70 (c) "Historic Era Nominee" means an enrolled Oneida elder, or a deceased person of
71 verifiable Oneida ancestry, whose record in either academics, sports or personal achievement
72 was established a minimum of 25 years prior to being nominated.

73 (d) "Modern Era Nominee" means an enrolled Oneida, either living or deceased, whose
74 record in either academics, sports or personal achievement was established a minimum of
75 five (5) years prior to being nominated.

76 (e) "Quality Leadership Team" means, for the purposes of this law, the Area Managers and
77 Key Directors from all the service areas of the Government Service Division. However, only
78 those members of the Quality Leadership Team who are Tribal members or those members
79 of the Quality Leadership Team who are spouses of Tribal members may serve on the Hall
80 of Fame Selection Committee. A Tribal member designee shall substitute for the non-spouse
81 or non-Tribal member for the purpose of carrying out the selection responsibilities of this law
82 but is not intended to replace that member of the Quality Leadership Team.

83 (f) "Selection Committee" means the Oneida Hall of Fame Selection Committee which shall
84 be responsible for selecting inductees for the Hall of Fame on a tri-annual basis.

85
86 **83.4. Tri-Annual Induction**

87 83.4-1. In accordance with this law, the Oneida Tribe on a tri-annual basis, may induct into the Hall
88 of Fame three (3) Modern Era and three (3) Historic Era nominees into the Oneida Hall of Fame at
89 the Oneida Tribe July Pow Wow.

90 (a) From the Modern Era, three (3) persons may be inducted into the Hall of Fame as
91 follows:

- 92 (1) One (1) person for Academics;
93 (2) One (1) person for Sports;
94 (3) One (1) person for Personal Achievement.
95 (b) From the Historical Era, three (3) persons may be inducted into the Hall of Fame as
96 follows:
97 (1) One (1) person for Academics;
98 (2) One (1) person for Sports;
99 (3) One (1) person for Personal Achievement.

100

101 **83.5. Eligibility for Nomination Into the Hall of Fame**

102 83.5-1. A nominee for induction into the Hall of Fame under the Modern Era classification shall
103 meet the requirements as defined under 83.3-1(d).

104 83.5-2. A nominee for induction into the Hall of Fame under the Historic Era classification shall
105 meet the requirements as defined under 83.3-1(c).

106 83.5-3. Any nominee who is not selected for induction may be considered for the next tri-annual
107 induction without having his or her name resubmitted. However, if he or she is not selected for
108 induction at the second tri-annual induction attempt, his or her name will need to be resubmitted in
109 order to receive consideration at a future date.

110

111 **83.6. Selection Committee**

112 83.6-1. *Appointment.* There is hereby created a Selection Committee. Members shall adhere to all
113 Tribal laws, codes, policies and procedures with the strictest confidentiality. The Committee shall
114 consist of:

115 (a) members of the Quality Leadership Team who are Tribal members, or spouses of Tribal
116 members. Members of the Quality Leadership Team who are non-Tribal members or who
117 are not spouses of Tribal members shall designate a Tribal member from their department
118 to perform the Hall of Fame Selection Committee duties;

119 (b) one (1) Oneida Business Committee member, selected at the beginning of each term; and

120 (c) one (1) Tribal member, appointed by the Oneida Business Committee.

121 83.6-2. *Expiration of Terms.* The term of the Tribal member appointed by the Oneida Business
122 Committee shall expire thirty (30) days after the induction ceremony under 83.8-2.

123 83.6-3. At the first meeting of the Selection Committee, they shall elect from among themselves a
124 Chairperson, Vice Chairperson and Secretary.

125 83.6-4. If a vacancy occurs on the Selection Committee prior to the selection of inductees to the Hall
126 of Fame for that tri-ennium, a replacement shall be appointed in accordance with the Tribal law or
127 policy governing boards, committees and commissions.

128 83.6-5. The Selection Committee shall abide by their own bylaws as ratified by the Oneida Business
129 Committee.

130

131 **83.7. Selection Process**

132 83.7-1. The Selection Committee shall provide notice to the community when nominations are being
133 taken for selection into the Hall of Fame and shall also request from the Director the record of
134 nominations still eligible for induction pursuant to 83.5-3.

135 (a) Notice shall include:

- 136 (1) How to acquire an application for induction;
137 (2) Categories of induction under 83.4;
138 (3) Deadlines for submission of applications and supporting documentation.
- 139 83.7-2. During the selection process, the Selection Committee shall maintain a file of applications
140 from persons directly applying for induction into the Hall of Fame as well as applications from
141 persons applying on behalf of or in support of a person recommended for induction.
- 142 83.7-3. The Selection Committee shall, within a reasonable time after the deadline for submissions
143 has passed, review the applications submitted to determine if the information provided is sufficient
144 to be sent to the Director for verification.
- 145 83.7-4. The Selection Committee by a majority vote, may determine, or the Director may request
146 the Selection Committee to determine, to withdraw the name or names of nominees from
147 consideration for induction if submitted documentation supporting induction into the Hall of Fame
148 cannot be verified or is false.
- 149 83.7-5. The Selection Committee shall discuss the achievements of the nominees. The Selection
150 Committee will then be asked to support, or not support each nominee by a secret vote. Only the
151 names of the nominees who receive a majority vote of support from the Selection Committee shall
152 be considered still in contention for induction into the Hall of Fame.
- 153 83.7-6. The Final Vote of the Selection Committee.
- 154 (a) Each Selection Committee member shall cast a secret vote for his or her choice in each
155 individual category. Those names of the nominees who receive the most votes in each
156 category shall be submitted to the Oneida Business Committee for a resolution inducting
157 each recommended nomination into the Hall of Fame.
- 158 (1) In the case of a tie vote in any particular category, an additional vote, including
159 only the nominees that had the tie vote, shall be taken until a single nominee is
160 determined, or
- 161 (2) If the tie cannot be broken after a re-vote, the Chairman of the Selection
162 Committee shall select who will be inducted into the Hall of Fame from among the
163 tied votes.
- 164 (c) Upon the completion of the final vote, all members of the Selection Committee shall sign
165 the results of the final vote. The Chairman shall deliver the final vote and all inductee
166 applications and documentation, within one (1) business day, to the Oneida Tribal
167 Secretary's Office for deposit.

168 **83.8. Induction Resolution**

170 83.8-1. *Oneida Business Committee Resolution.* No later than the month of June of the induction
171 year, the Selection Committee shall request that the Oneida Business Committee adopt individual
172 resolutions affirming each nomination for induction into the Hall of Fame.

173 83.8-2. *Induction Ceremony.* The reading of the resolutions including the inductee's name and
174 achievements shall occur at a special ceremony at the Oneida Tribe Pow Wow in July of an induction
175 year.

176 83.8-3. Notification of the induction ceremony shall be posted in the Kalihwisaks.

177 **83.9. Record Keeping**

178 83.9-1. The Selection Committee shall submit all remaining applications and supporting
179

180 documentation to the Director for record keeping.
181 83.9-2. The Director shall retain nominee applications and supporting documentation for
182 consideration at the next tri-annual induction, unless the nomination would no longer be eligible
183 pursuant to 83.5-3.

184
185 **83.10. Recall**
186 83.10-1. In any case whereby it is discovered that fraud or incorrect information was of sufficient
187 basis to withdraw an inducted person's name from the Hall of Fame, such a determination shall be
188 made by a subsequently designated Selection Committee providing:
189 (a) The Director has conducted a full investigation on the matter; and
190 (b) The Director recommends that such person's name be withdrawn from the Hall of Fame.
