The following are the winter weather guidelines our program will follow, if the weather “feels like”:


11°F or above Outside Time—Normal amount of time: 6 Wks. to 5Yrs.

1°F to 10°F Outside Time —10 minutes: 6 Wks. to 5Yrs.

0°F or below No outside time: 6 Wks to 2Yrs.

10°F or below No outside time: 2Yrs. to 5Yrs.
