**ORDER TO LIFT STAY**

---

This case has come before the Oneida Trial Court, Honorable Denice Beans presiding.

**BACKGROUND**

On December 7, 2018 Petitioner filed for and was granted a Temporary Restraining Order for the following:

Respondent(s), Annette Cornelius, Tina Jorgensen, and Kristine M. Hill are ordered to desist and refrain from:

- 1) Cultural Heritage from filling the Indigenous Healer/Practitioner position that was promised to the Petitioner.
- 2) Community Health Services (CHS) from posting Petitioner's current job position.
- 3) Petitioner's current Supervisor from enforcing Petition's last day of work, that is scheduled to be December 21, 2018.

The temporary Restraining Order was extended to expire in 28 days due to an emergency medical situation. A hearing was scheduled for January 4, 2019 at 9:00 am.

On December 12, 2018 Respondent Tina Jorgensen filed a *Motion for Dismissal*.

On December 14, 2018 the Petitioner filed a *Motion to Withdraw Temporary Restraining Order*.

The Petitioner and the current CHS Supervisor have agreed to an extension of the last day of work from December 21, 2018 to January 18, 2019. The Petitioner intends to pursue the Cultural Heritage position or seek other employment on her own.

The *Motion to Withdraw Temporary Restraining Order* is granted.

**ORDER**

The court enters the following order:

Pursuant to 803.21-1(b) of the Oneida Judiciary Rules of Civil Procedure case #18-TC-026 is dismissed without prejudice.

IT IS SO ORDERED.

By the authority vested in the Oneida Judiciary pursuant to Resolution 01-07-13-B of the General Tribal Council an Order was signed on December 14, 2018.
