RESOLUTION # 1-03-01-A

2001 Highway Safety Protection Project

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has determined that the overall goal is to protect, maintain and improve the standard of living and the environment in which the Oneida people live, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Environmental Health and Safety Department was created for the purpose of providing services that preserve, restore and enhance our environment, and protect and educate our people consistent with the culture, vision and priorities of the Oneida Nation, and


WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe understands that Native Americans have a high rate of alcohol-related crashes and a low rate of occupant protection use and that the number one cause of injury and death to Native Americans ages 1-44 is automobile crashes, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe further understands that methods to address transportation safety needs in Tribal populations will be discussed and developed in order to educate Tribal and community members at a Transportation Safety Conference, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin authorizes the submission of a Highway Safety Protection Project Agreement to the Wisconsin Department of Transportation/Bureau of Transportation Safety for the purpose of hosting a 2001 Native American Transportation Safety Conference.
