- WHEREAS the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has developed a Seventh Generation commitment and has set National Priorities that provide for community wellness, and
- WHEREAS the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin realizes the overwhelming high rates of breast cancer in Native American populations, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has been informed that overall breast cancer rates are higher in this region due to the high amounts of PCB's found in the regions soil, animals, and foods, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has determined that there is a high need to provide direct access to breast cancer education and outreach, emotional support, examinations, and follow-up to our Oneida women and their families.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin supports and submits application to the Avon Breast Health Access Fund to provide outreach services to medically under served women within our service area.
