


Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc.

RESOLUTION 75-1-20

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin have a Comprehensive Economic Development Plan now in progress.
- WHEREAS, part of this Comprehensive Plan is land consolidation
- WHEREAS, the land that makes up the Wisconsin State Reformatory farm, located in Oneida & Hobart townships, consist of 1,631 acres of land which lies within the meets and bounds of original reservation (65,731) area.
- WHEREAS, this W.S.R. farm may be terminated in the not too distant future.
- WHEREAS, as the Oneida Tribe wishes to incorporate said farm (1,631 acres) into their Tribal holdings for the purpose of a Tribal farm.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the 1973 Senate Bill 846 be reintroduced in the Wisconsin State Senate establishing as the policy of the state (Wis.) that where governmentally owned surplus lands located within or contiguous to an Indian Reservation are to be transferred, the Indian Tribe is to be preferred as transferee of such lands.
