RESOLUTION # 1-35-85-C

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governmental body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee, by Ordinance No. 1 of April 20, 1963 created and chartered the Oneida Housing Authority, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee leased to the Oneida Housing Authority for housing purposes, a parcel of Oneida Tribal lands located in part of Government Lot 22 and part of Government Lot 23, Section 29, Township 24 North, Range 20 East, Oneida Indian Reservation, City of Green Bay, Brown County, Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Housing Authority will develop and construct Housing Project Wis. No. 10-8 on the leased parcel of land, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Housing Authority requests the Oneida Business Committee to grant easements to the City of Green Bay over strips of land to be used for sewer purposes within the Housing Project Wis. No. 10-8 site, and

WHEREAS, the City of Green Bay has agreed to accept the easements to be used for sewer purposes, and


WHEREAS, the legal descriptions of the easements is attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Oneida Business Committee hereby approves and grants the easements herein described to be used for sewer purposes in the Housing Project Wis. No. 10-8 site to the City of Green Bay, Wisconsin, and requests the Superintendent, Great Lakes Agency, to prepare and recommend approval of the easements granted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents for the easements granted to the City of Green Bay, Wisconsin, for and on behalf of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.

A strip of land to be used for sewer purposes and located in part of Government Lot 23, Section 29, Township 24 North, Range 20 East, City of Green Bay, Brown County, Wisconsin described as follows:

Commencing at the West One-Quarter corner of said Section 29, thence S 0°-16'-14" W 1,587.21 feet; thence N 89°-48'-54" E 330.00 feet; thence N 0°-16'-14" E 180.00 feet to the point of beginning; thence continuing N 0°-16'-14" E 20.00 feet; thence S 89°-48'-54" W 130.00 feet; thence S 0°-16'-14" W 20.00 feet; thence N 89°-48'-54" E 130.00 feet to the point of beginning.
