- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe through the Oneida Community Apple Orchard would like to provide nutritious, healthy apples, fruits, and other produce in an environmentally safe, and economically viable fashion, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe believes that the Oneida Family will be strengthened by providing environmental safe products that will promote the overall health and wellness of all Oneida Community members.
