## BC Resolution 02-12-14-A

### Designate Lauren Hartman as alternate Tribal Representative to Fee-to-Trust Consortium

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1, of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS,** in accordance with the Terms and Conditions of the Memorandum of Understanding between Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin and The Bureau of Indian Affairs-Midwest Regional Office for FY 2014-2017, Section 1. (c.) The Tribe will submit a letter identifying the designated tribal representative and alternates for the purpose of representation at Council Meetings, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a participating tribe within the Fee-to-Trust Consortium and Lauren Hartman is the current Realty Specialist Coordinator for Fee-to-Trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has selected Lauren Hartman as its designated representative for the Fee-to-Trust Consortium Council Meetings as an alternate, and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Oneida Business Committee hereby designates Lauren Hartman as the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin's alternate Tribal Representative for the Fee-to-Trust Consortium.

### CERTIFICATION
